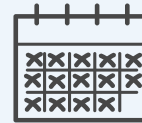
KETCHUM: Drive-up: Lupine Building, 220 S. 2nd Ave, Suite 103

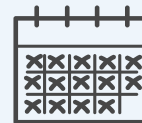
KETCHUM: Servicio al coche: Lupine Building, 220 S. 2nd Ave, Suite 103

Who are we?

COVID Outreach Wood River is a Community COVID Health Fair produced by collaboration between the St. Luke's Wood River Foundation and Dr. Tom Archie, MD to expand the local availability of COVID19 Viral Detection nasal swab PCR testing.

Currently, testing is only available in the Wood River Valley for people with clear COVID19 symptoms.

Our goal is to fill a COVID PCR testing gap produced by the lack of available testing for asymptomatic people who 1) have had a close-contact exposure to someone with COVID19, 2) have an upcoming out-of-area medical procedure requiring testing, or 3) are considering periodic screening of people who live or work in close contact with many others. Also served are people who are symptomatic but have difficulty accessing testing.

By increasing testing availability, a greater number of people with new COVID19 infections will be able more quickly to self-quarantine and thereby protect others. Combined with social distancing, wearing masks when around non-household people, and frequent hand washing, expanded viral detection testing is part of a strategy to suppress the pandemic and keep our people healthy and our economy strong.

Is there a cost for testing?

- There is no charge for COVID19 Viral Detection nasal swab testing.

Where are testing locations?

- Temporary testing sites
 - Ketchum: Drive-up: Lupine Building, 220 S. 2nd Ave, Suite 103
 - Hailey: Drive-up: Blaine County School District Office, 118 Bullion St, Hailey
 - Bellevue: Drive-up: South Central Public Health, 117 Ash St, Bellevue
- Mobile outreach testing on site at businesses, schools, or other organizations with at least 10 people to be tested can be arranged as available and prudent.

When are testing locations open?

- Monday - Saturday
- Check the website for which testing sites are open on which days. Tentative schedule as follows:
 - Monday: Ketchum
 - Tuesday: Hailey
 - Wednesday: Bellevue
 - Thursday: Ketchum
 - Friday: Hailey
 - Saturday: Bellevue
- Do not enter buildings. Look for signage. Test sample collection is performed in your car. Schedule testing online only.

When are final test results reported?

- Within 24-36 hours

What should I do while waiting for my test result?

- **Stay in isolation** until your test has been completed and its result is final.
- Do not go to any public place or business during this time.

What are we NOT doing?

- We are not establishing a physician-patient relationship or providing medical advice beyond test-result-specific recommendations. Requests for medical advice are redirected to the individual's primary physician.
- We are not testing for antibodies to SARS-CoV-2.
- We are not testing for other infections, such as influenza, respiratory syncytial virus, Epstein-Barr virus, or strep throat.
- We are not doing a physical examination.
- This is not part of a research study.

Scheduling Tests will be done online only

- No Symptoms but exposed? Test 5-8 days after "close contact" exposure
- Symptoms are present? Test 2-3 days after onset of symptoms
- Not for those who have tested positive within the last 3 months

Webpage includes educational information:

- What do I do if my viral detection test is positive?
- What do I do if my viral detection test is negative?
- What is a close contact exposure?
- What is our testing prioritization strategy?

Outreach across digital, cultural, or language barrier divides:

- While the website and its scheduling function will go live with only a Google Translate button to help bridge the language barrier, efforts are underway to include everyone in the valley in this testing outreach access including the following elements.
- Translation of the website and scheduling questionnaire into Spanish
- Positioning testing locations on bus lines and near bus stops
- Scheduling weekend testing on Saturdays in Bellevue (and Fridays in Hailey)
- Planning extend into a mobile format for businesses with many employees and outbreak concerns
- Online-only scheduling and communication can remain a barrier for some, though the informational website and scheduling system functions well on mobile devices
- Spanish language interpreter services being sought and arranged with a goal of being in place by mid-November
