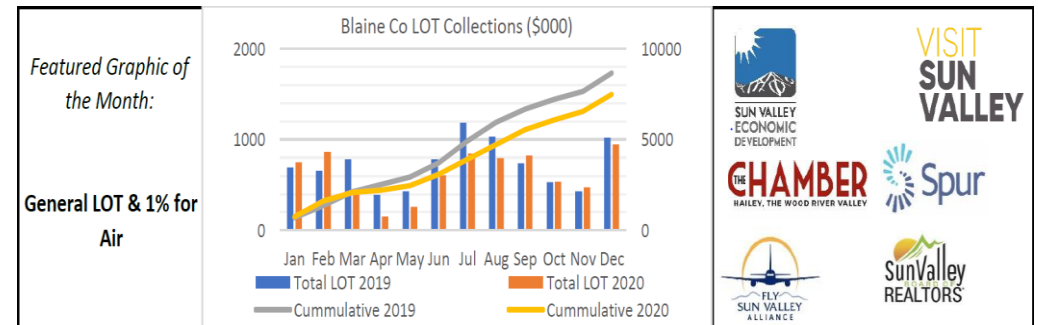

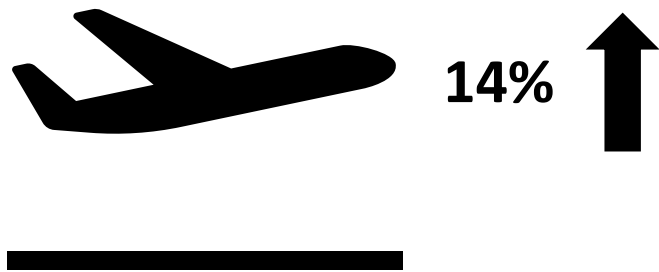

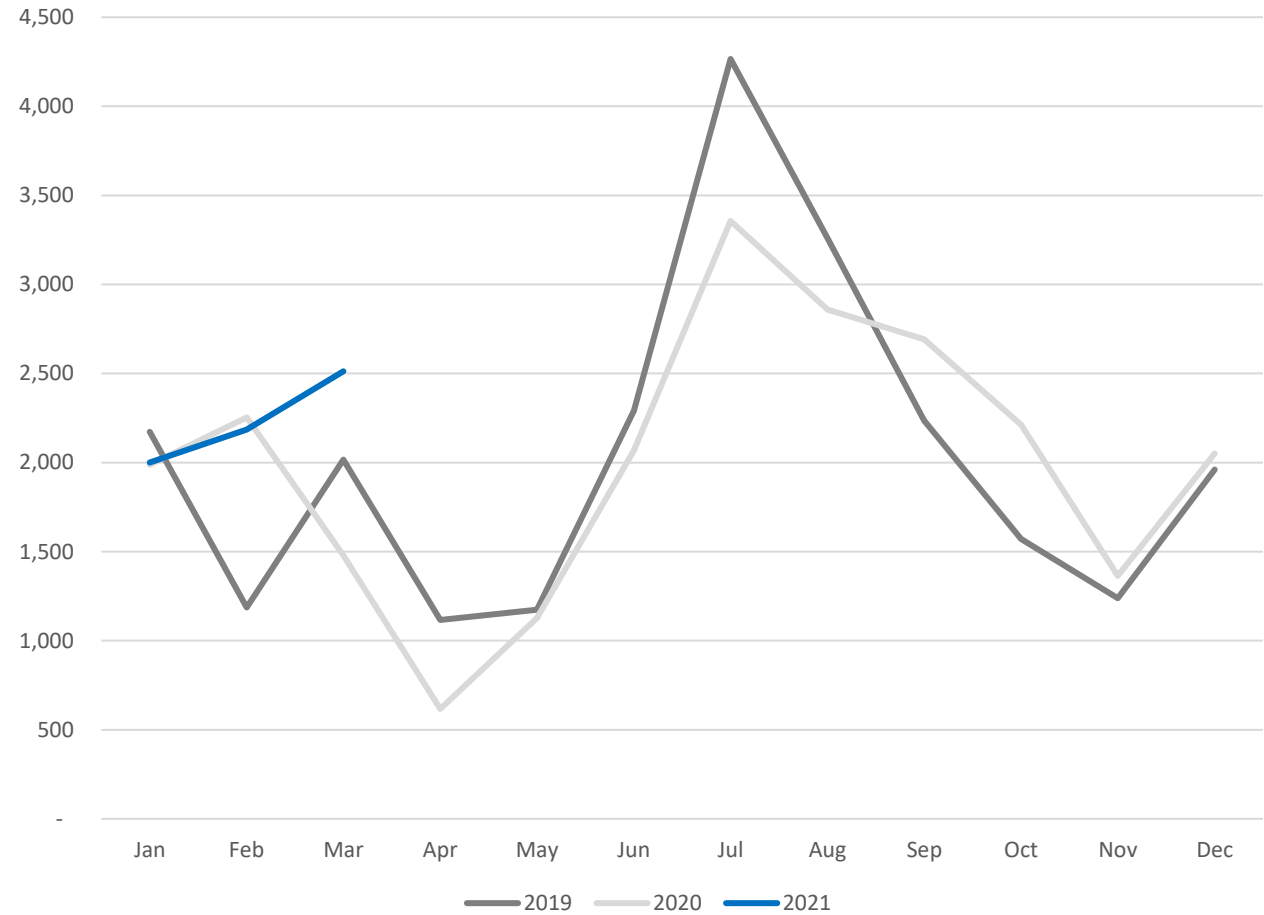

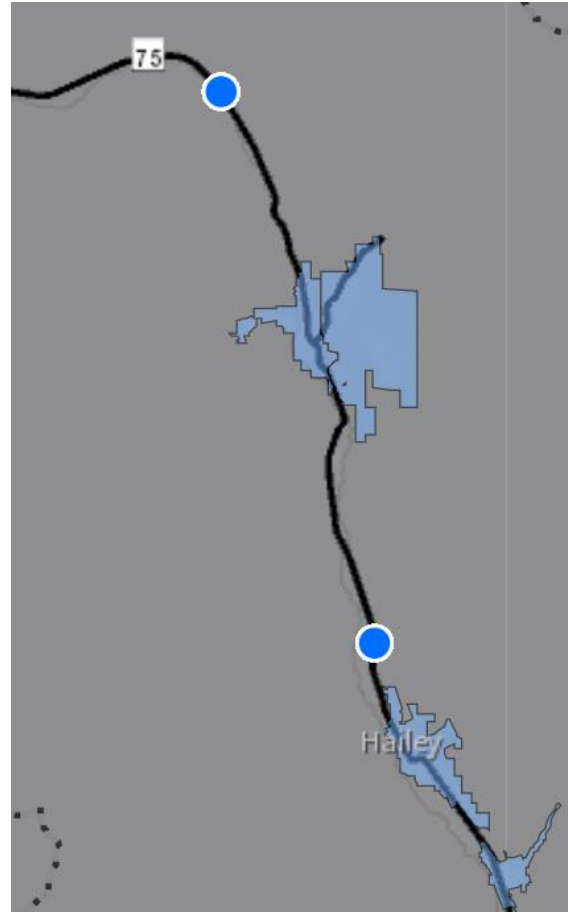

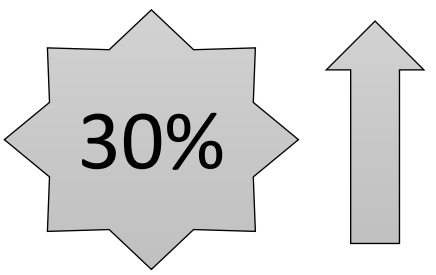
SUN General Aviation Operations (# landings)



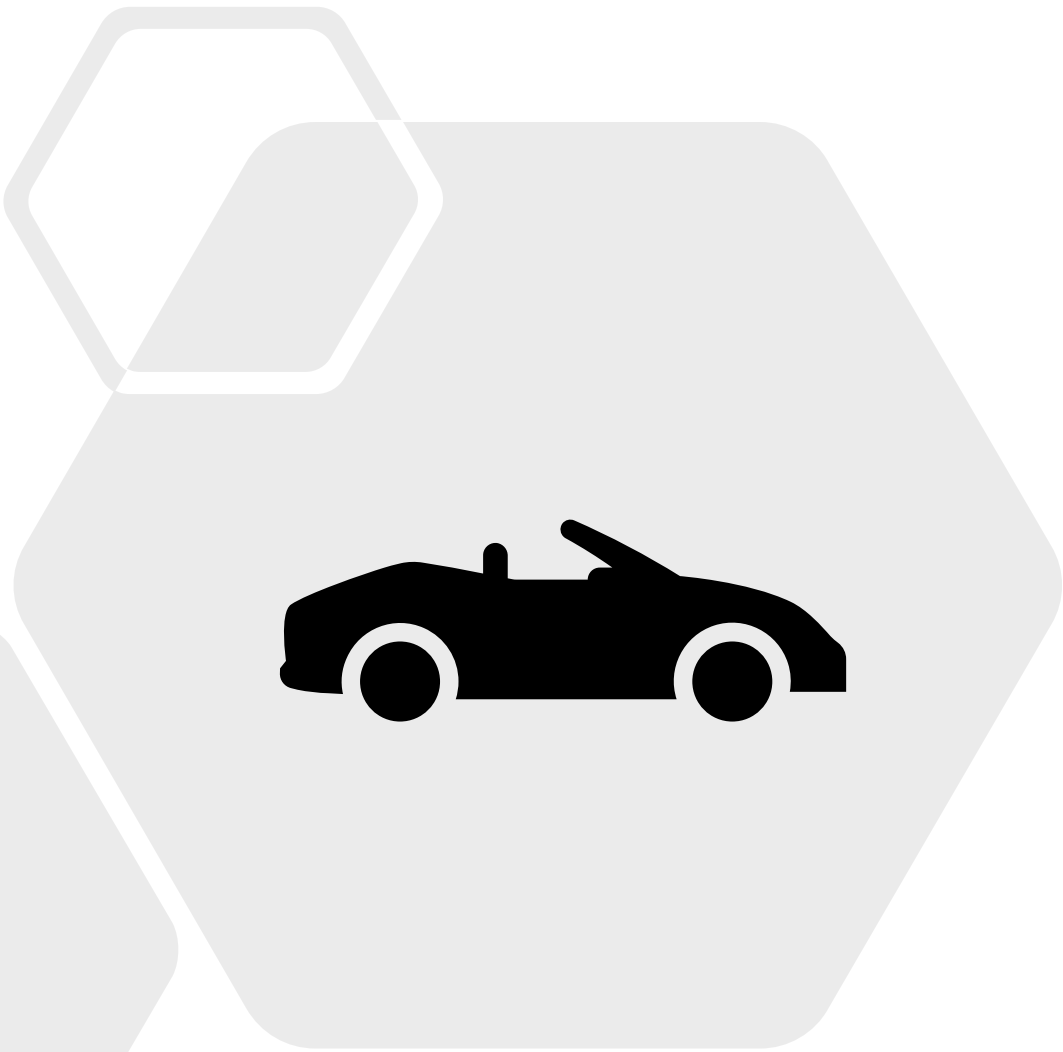

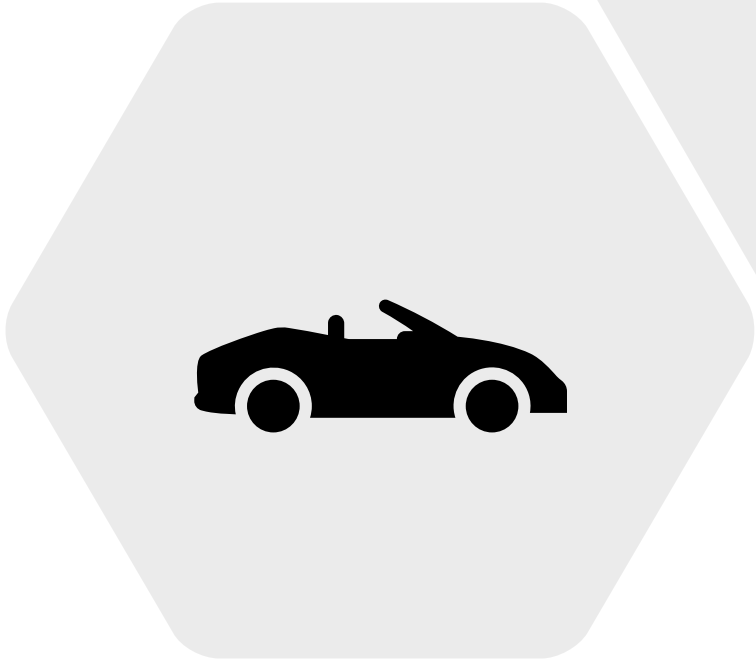

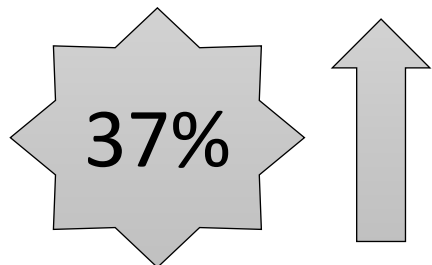

Total counts April – March pre and post Covid

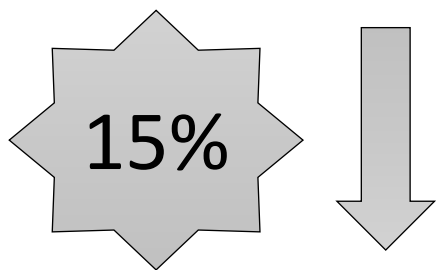

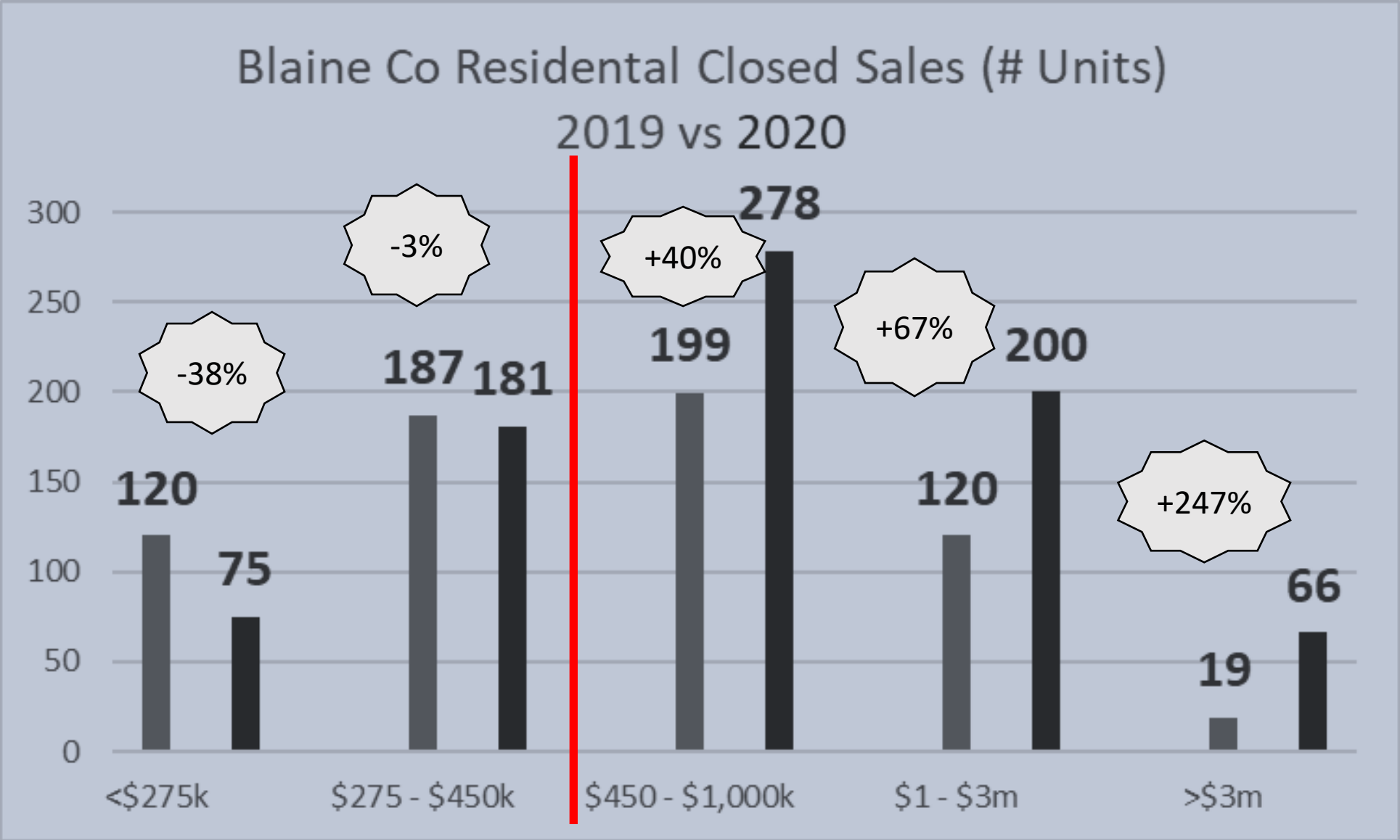

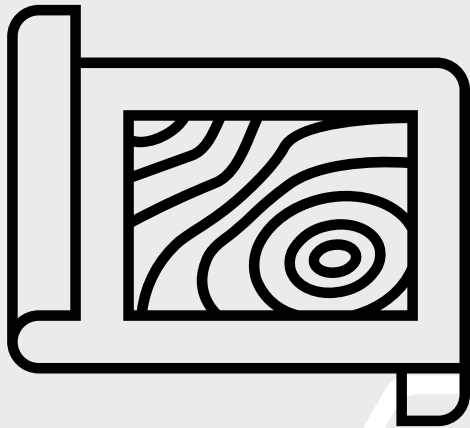

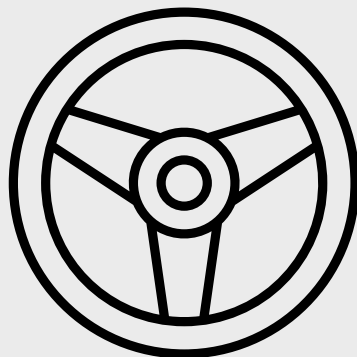

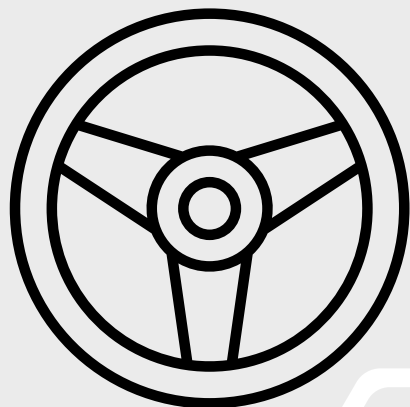
Vacant Land Sales

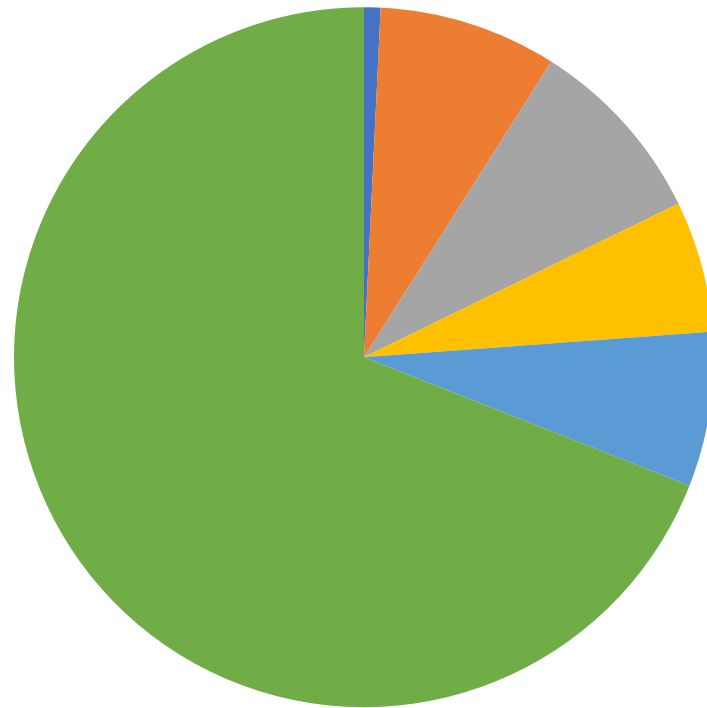

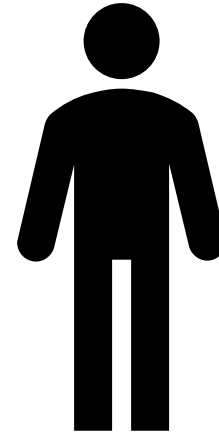
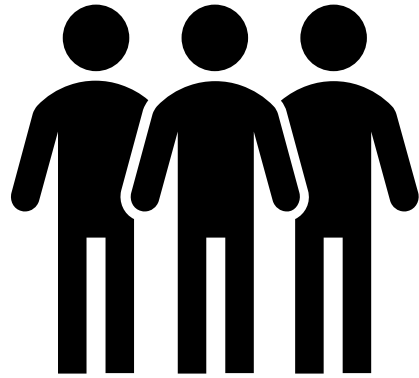

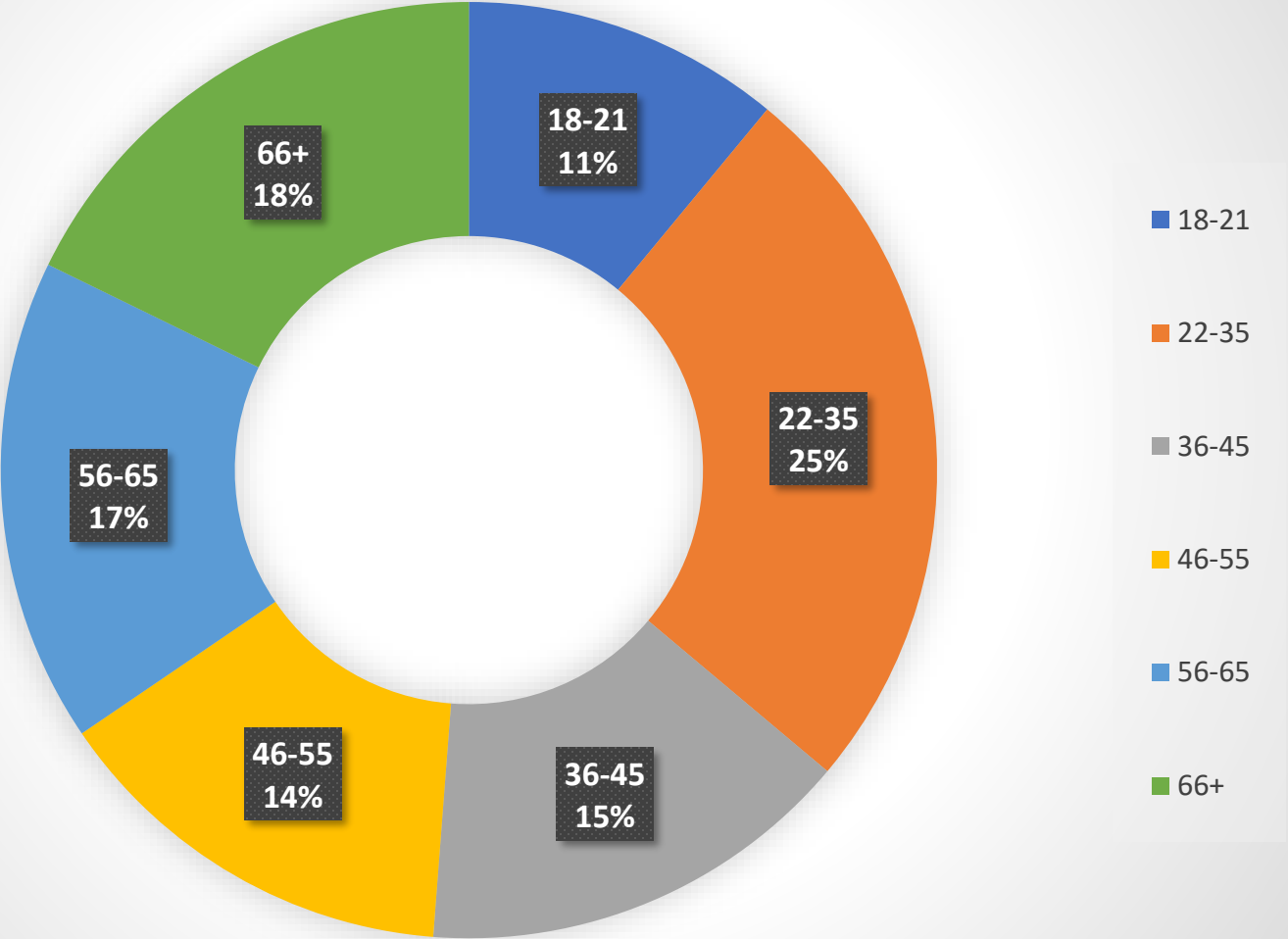

Conclusions



- 3,370 people have registered to vote since April 2020
 - Evenly distributed across age groups
 - Most are registered in Hailey or Ketchum
- Enplanements are recovering
- There are fewer STR listings
- Real Estate levels (# of transactions and \$ Volume) are at unprecedented levels
- Blaine County issued 923 new driving licenses since April 2020
 - 69% are 61 years or older



THE FACTS



What does it
mean for the
Economy?

- More residents to support business
- Helped keep the restaurants and retail in business during a national recession
- Trimmed our peak times and filled in the troughs of slack
- LOT revenue that supports municipal services performed above expectations (reduced tax burden)
- Lines are blurred even more between the “resident economy” and the “visitor economy”

Incomplete Profile

- Reconcile conflicting data
- Determine what is “noise” and what is meaningful
- What are the long-term intentions of the new resident?
- Will new residents seek local jobs eventually?
- Working on mobility data, resident surveys and more
